## Community

The School District of Green Lake serves the educational needs of the city of Green Lake and the surrounding rural area. Located in central Wisconsin in a resort community, the district enjoys the benefits of small town living, an emphasis on recreation, and a concern for the environment. Currently, the district consists of 265 students, 4K – 12, under one roof. The student body is 93% white, 1% American Indian, 1% Black, 1% Asian, 4% Hispanic, and 2% Multiracial.

## School

The School District is the first IB World School (4k-12) in the State of Wisconsin with approved Diploma Programme (DP), Middle Years Programme (MYP), and Primary Years Programme (PYP). Green Lake High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 95 students in grades 9 through 12. The high school is accredited by the State of Wisconsin.

## Curriculum

The academic program is organized on a traditional two semester, eight period day schedule. Seven (7) credits per semester is the minimum course load a student may take. Students must earn 26 credits to receive a high school diploma.

**International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme** offerings include the following: English HL, French/Spanish HL/SL, Economics SL, Geography SL, History HL, Psychology SL, Biology HL/SL, Chemistry HL/SL, Physics SL, Environmental Systems and Society SL, Math Studies SL, Math SL, Music SL, Visual Arts SL, TOK (Theory of Knowledge), EE (Extended Essay), and CAS (Creativity, Action, Service).

**AP® coursework** is offered online through Wisconsin Virtual School and includes Art History, Biology, Calculus AB and BC, Chemistry, Computer Science A, English Language, English Literature, Environmental Science, European History, French Language, Human Geography, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Physics B, Psychology, Spanish Language, Statistics, U.S. Government & Politics, U.S. History, and World History.

The **Youth Options Program** enables juniors and/or seniors to enroll in technical college or university courses and earn college credits at area institutions of higher education including but not limited to Ripon College (designated RC), Moraine Park Technical College (MPTC), the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh (UW), and the University of Wisconsin Online (designated UW).

**Online High School Coursework** is provided through the Wisconsin Virtual School (designated WVS) to enrich the curriculum. Courses offered may be core, remedial, enrichment or Advanced Placement (AP).

Rank-in-Class is based on grades in all courses. Courses are not weighted.

### GPA Calculation

GPA is computed using the above quality points. Beginning with grade 9, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. A minimum of 26 credits is required for graduation. Semester grades are recorded on the transcript and grade point average is computed in January and June.

### Class of 2014 Post-High School Placement

74% matriculate to four year colleges or universities.

17% matriculate to 2-year technical and/or proprietary colleges.

9% select work, military service, or other.
